



CALL FOR PAPERS

The Hawaii Psychological Association (HPA) is pleased to announce a *Call for Papers* for its Annual Convention to be held at the Ala Moana Hotel on **October 28 & 29, 2010.* This year's theme is Tradition & Vision!**

Consistent with this theme, priority will be given to papers which highlight visionary practice models across private and public sectors of psychology, new twists on traditional efforts that place psychologists as key figures in health care service delivery and health care reform, and advocacy to enhance leadership efforts amongst psychologists in order to influence, inform, and fulfill our profession's broad mission.

The convention program and registration forms for HPA's annual convention will be available in September. All program participants, members, nonmembers, and students are expected to register for the meeting and pay the appropriate registration fees.

This *Call* is for paper sessions addressing a common theme, individual papers and poster presentations, symposia, and roundtable sessions. In addition, workshops based upon the results of a membership survey of interest will be arranged. We especially encourage the submission of roundtable sessions: discussion groups or special presentations organized around a topic of potential interest to the membership. If you are interested in organizing a roundtable session, please provide a brief description of the activity you are proposing with your application.

Paper sessions, symposia, and roundtable sessions provide for an interchange among participants, and between the audience and participants. Each will be scheduled for 90 minutes, is normally limited to three participants, and must have a chairperson responsible for introducing the material and providing background for the ensuing discussion. At the end of the session, either the chair or a discussant is to provide an overview. The chair is also responsible for keeping individual participants within the time constraints. **HPA abides by APA rules: paper sessions and symposia are not to be used as paper-reading sessions.** Participants should speak from notes; reading papers detracts from the spirit of the proceedings. Inclusion of ethical considerations and use of audiovisual aids is strongly encouraged, as is making material available to the audience, e.g. a written summary, resource lists, or handout.

Individual papers may also be submitted. If accepted, these submissions will either be included as part of a paper session or as a poster, at the discretion of the Program Committee. Please provide a list of key words by topic and audience interest. If enough papers are submitted on a given topic, and there is time in the program, these submissions may be combined into a paper session chaired by a member appointed by the Program Committee. Otherwise, these papers will be accepted as posters. Individual papers can also be submitted directly as posters. Individuals whose papers are accepted for a poster session should prepare abbreviated text with tables, graphs, data, etc. clearly readable from a distance of 2 to 3 feet, mounted on a poster board.

Student submissions are particularly welcome. The HPA Student Paper Award will be presented for the best student paper presentation. Award recipients receive a perpetual trophy to display at their academic institution as well as a cash award.

“Going Green”: Handouts and materials should be made available in advance for posting on the HPA website (www.hawaiipsychology.org) where they will be accessible to paid participants for a limited period of time.
